

Countrylane Woods Honeysuckle Eradication Event

Preliminary Meeting of Crew Leaders: Monday October 17, 7 pm at Club House

Work Dates: Saturday October 29 and Saturday November 5; 9 am - 12 pm

Rain Date: Saturday November 12; 9 am - 12 pm

What we plan to do: Cut honeysuckle plants at base, apply Roundup to both cut portion of stump and around the perimeter of the stump. Next, we will remove the cut brush and move it to designated places for a Monday pick up by chipper service. The cut brush will likely need to be cut into smaller pieces to minimize size of brush piles.

1 **Volunteer workers**

There should be sufficient volunteers to draw from. There were over 80 who responded in the summer survey that they would help. That said, it would be helpful for crew leaders to recruit additional Volunteer workers from their neighborhood as needed.

2 **Volunteer Assignments**

Volunteers will be assigned to specific Crew Leaders by Dexter Hall. A list of these will be provided in advance to each Crew Leader.

3 **Crew Leader Assigned Area**

Dexter Hall will notify you of the area assigned to you.

4 **Crew Composition and Tasks**

1) Individual with chain saw to do cutting. 2) Individual with spray applicator to apply Roundup to cut stump and to mark stump as treated with spray paint. 3) Three to five individuals to drag cut brush to pick up locations.

5 **Liability Waiver Forms**

Crew Leaders have each worker sign liability waiver form. Dexter Hall will pick these up the morning of the event.

6 **Equipment Needed from Crew Leaders and volunteers**

Cooler for water and ice. Ice and water will be delivered to you the morning of the event. Chain saw. Sprayer for mixing and applying Roundup.

7 **Resident Cooperation**

Select common ground entry and exit points for workers. Cut brush will be brought out of common ground through these points.

Get neighbor permission to stack brush along curb. Chipping unit will arrive Monday following the Saturday work days to remove brush.
